Preiswerk, of 21, Nonnenweg, Basle, who has been informed by Sir Patrick Scrivener, Her Britannic Majesty's Minister in Berne, that His late Majesty King George VI had graciously bestowed on him "the dignity of an Honorary Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire in recognition of his services to British Interests during the war".

The insignia was presented to Mr. Preiswerk by Her Majesty's Consul at Basle on the 27th of February, the day of the first Investiture of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth.

Mr. Preiswerk was during the last war that at the head of the Special Division of the Swiss Legation, and whilst in London, he, and Madame Preiswerk, took a great interest in the life of the Colony; we feel sure, that his many friends in this country will be delighted with the news of this much deserved distinction.

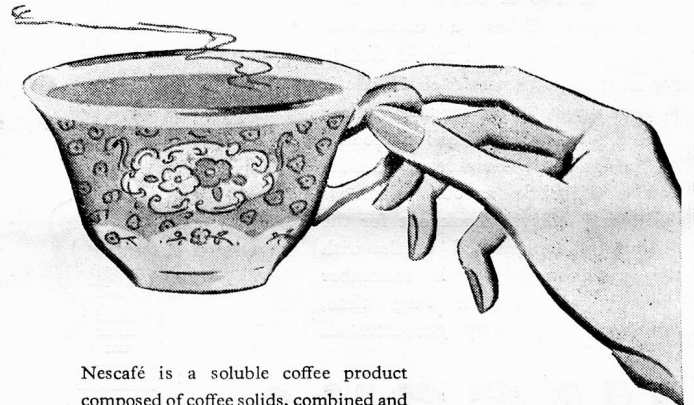
