LONDON VISIT OF THEATRE DE POCHE, GENEVE.

From July 13th to July 18th the Swiss Colony of London will have an opportunity to see a Swiss theatre company from Geneva, the Théâtre de Poche, perform a comedy "Edmée" by the French author P. Bréal. This merry farce seems to have been a great success at Geneva and elsewhere. And the reputation of the Théâtre de Poche is such that the Arts Theatre Club behind Leicester Square Tube Station at 6, Newport Street, felt encouraged to give the company a booking for an entire week. This seems to be somewhat daring as the performances are in French. It is the more to be hoped that the Colony will support the show by turning up in force. Tickets at 10/6, 7/6 and 5/6 can only be obtained by or through members of the Arts Theatre, this being a private Theatre Club. Anyone wishing to go, but not knowing any other member, may apply for tickets through Mrs. Paul Bessire, 28, Cumberland Road, Barnes, S.W.13, acting at the request of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique. The correct amount should be remitted with the application by cheque or postal order made out directly to the Arts Theatre Club.

PINSCHEWER FILMS.

An N.S.H. Show.

Since long before the war a producer of films from animated drawings etc., Pinschewer Films, has been established at Berne. A selection of 21 short films from this studio will be shown under the patronage of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique, London Group, on July 8th, at the British Council cinema, 6 Hanover Street, W.1. This includes illustrations of some Swiss folk songs as well as the most successful publicity films made by this firm from as early as 1910 onwards. In this programme we notice "Play of the waves" made for Swiss radio, "100 years of Swiss Railways", "Precision" made for Longine's watches, "Seva Play" on the Swiss Lottery, "The Soup", Maggi's 1910! The National Coal Board of Great Britain is also represented with "King Coal" and numerous firm of other countries. This should prove an entertaining evening from 7-8.30 p.m. Admission is free to all members and friends. Early arrival is advised to obtain good seats.
