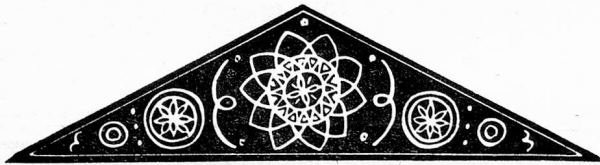

With deep regret we report the passing away of Mr. Maurice Bruscheiler, at the age of 69.

The deceased was born near Langenthal (Switzerland) on March 28th, 1886, and as a very young man came to this country where he was occupied in the butchery trade. Through sheer hard work he succeeded in getting his own shop in Great Titchfield Street, W.1, where he was well-known. Shortly before Christmas Maurice Bruscheiler sold his business and went into retirement, and now after only a few months rest, which he so well deserved, has left us.

Maurice Bruscheiler in his younger days was often seen in the Colony, he was a member of the Schweizerbund, Société de Secours Mutuels and Union Helvetia, where he had many friends who will sadly miss him. He leaves a widow to whom we tender our sincere sympathy.
