SWISS RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

Annual General Meeting.

The Annual General Meeting of the Swiss Rifle Association took place on Friday, April 15th, at the Glendower Hotel, Glendower Place, S.W.7.

Mr. Alfred Schmid was in the Chair and there were about 40 members present. The minutes of the last General Meeting were read by Mr. F. Magnin, Hon. Secretary, and accepted. Mr. F. Suter, explained the various items on the Balance Sheet which shows a small credit balance. The accounts were passed after a short discussion.

The President of the Association referred to the activities during 1954 saying that the membership had increased by two, and numbers now 59. Shooting practices were held on 10 Sundays at Bisley Camp. On October 10th the annual handicap competition and "Grümpelschiessen" took place. During 1954: 5,450 rounds of ammunition were used (1953: 4,730).

The winners in the following competitions were: *Handicap competition*: Mr. Alfred Schmid, 60 pts., "Grümpelschiessen": Mr. Marcel Bucherer, 58 pts., *Challenge Cup*: Mr. Peter Fischer, 312 pts. Highest score of the year: Mr. Marcel Bucherer; Best average of the year: Mr. Peter Fischer.

Mr. Schmid mentioned that at the Tir Fédéral in Lausanne, last year, 12 Swiss Societies from abroad had competed, and the Swiss Rifle Association was classed 6th with an average result of 46,200 pts., best result was attained by Mr. Walter Riesen, 49 pts.

The "Challenges des Sociétés suisse à l'Etranger" was won by London, with an average result of 65,693 pts., the best result was attained by Mr. Willy Fischer with 76 pts.

In the "Radio Weltschützenfest" the Swiss Rifle Association took second place with an average of 160 pts., they were also "Europa Sieger", best result: Mr. Peter Fischer, 55 pts.

Laurel wreaths were obtained by Messrs. Peter Fischer: 55 pts., Marcel Bucherer: 53 pts., Peter Odermatt: 53 pts. Willy Fischer: 52 pts. and J. C. Wetter: 50 pts.

The outgoing committee was re-elected with acclamation and consists of: President: Alfred Schmid, Vice-President: J.C. Wetter, Hon. Secretary and Treasurer: F. Magnin, Chief Range Officer: Willy Fischer, Range Officers: P. Odermatt, M. Bucherer, Major Weber, Herm. Schmid, Handicapper: F. Suter.

The Meeting was followed by an excellent dinner, at which Colonel P. Gygli, Military and Air Attaché at the Swiss Legation, and Mr. A. Stauffer, Editor of the "Swiss Observer" were the guests of the Society. *ST.*

SWISS COMPANY OF 60 IN "ALL NATIONS CAVALCADE" SONG AND DANCE.

On Sunday night May 15th at the Royal Albert Hall there will appear a company of 60 direct from Switzerland, they include the Zurich Male Choir, a Yodelling Choir in Swiss National Costume and an Alphorn blower. The Choir will sing in four languages, and they will certainly bring Switzerland to the minds of the British public and should cement the friendship of the two nations. Also representing Switzerland will be the Corale Unione Ticinese.

The audience will see a wonderful programme — there is a Polish choir of 60 and Polish, Spanish, Scottish, Austrian Schuplattlers, and Hungarian dancers, including the sensational Ukranian Cossack Dancers.

During the evening massed choirs will sing "Tales of the Vienna Woods". Tickets are 3/6, 5/-, 7/6, and 10/6, obtainable from Royal Albert Hall or by post from Mr. Russ Hardy, 9, Vernon House, Sicilian Avenue, W.C.1, enclosing a stamped addressed envelope, or telephone HOLborn 1225.
