NEWS AT RANDOM

The Federal-Council has appointed Monsieur Jean-Louis Pahud to the Federal post of Swiss Minister to Egypt and Ethiopia, with residence in Cairo, in succession to Minister André Boissier, who died in May of this year.

Minister Pahud was born at Lausanne in 1909, and is a citizen of Bioley-Magnoux (Ct. Vaud). He studied law at the Universities of Lausanne and Siena (Italy) and entered the Diplomatic Service in 1938. After having occupied a post at the Swiss Legation in Cairo, he returned to Berne where he held for two years a post at the Federal Economic Department.

In 1950, M. Pahud was transferred to Madrid in the capacity of 1st Counsellor of Legation. Since October, 1955, he was en poste in Addis Ababa, as Chargé d'Affiaires ad int.

Minister Alfred Zehnder, Head of the Division for Political Affairs, and General Secretary of the Federal Political Department in Berne, will in the near future receive a new appointment.

The Federal Council has nominated Minister Robert Kohli as his successor. The latter was born in 1896, and is a citizen of Rueschegg. (Ct. Berne). He studied juris prudence at the University of Berne, and entered in 1918, in the service of the Political Department where he occupied several important After having been promoted to the rank of posts. Counsellor of Legation, he was in 1945, nominated Swiss Minister at The Hague, and four years later (1949) to Belgrade in the same capacity. On June 30th, 1953, he left the Political Department to become President of the "Schweizerischen Verrechnungsstelle ".

The two Federal Chambers - National and States Council - assembled on the 17th of September in Berne for their three weeks autumn session.

The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (World Bank) announced in Washington,

that it has entered into an agreement with the Swiss Government, subject to ratification, under which the Swiss Government would lend 200 million francs (£17,000,000) to the Bank.

Customs receipts during the month of August, 1956, totalled 78.9 million francs. The net amount for the benefit of the Confederation amounts to 55.9 million francs, or 10.1 million francs more than in August, 1955.

Receipts for the first eight months of the current year total 431.0 million francs, which is 49.6 million francs more than in the same period in 1955.


Switzerland has declined Colonel Nasser's invitation to join the organisation he is setting up to negotiate a revision of the Suez Canal Treaty of 1888. An official communiqué explains that Switzerland was not a party to the treaty, and that her few oceangoing ships almost never use the Canal.

The Swiss Government has announced that it has decided to open negotiations for the "provisional adherence " of Switzerland to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade. (G.A.T.T.).

The traditional conference of Swiss Ministers took place in Berne from September 6th to 8th, under the Presidency of M. Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister. A large number of Swiss Ministers abroad attended the conference.

A party of Swiss climbers, aged 15 - 20, had made the ascent of the Jungfrau (13,630 ft.) without guides. On their way down one of them slipped on an icy slope, dragging the whole party after him. They were all on one rope. They fell about 2,000 ft. before coming to rest.

Five were killed, and four seriously injured. The names of the victims are: Werner and Hans Zurbrügg, and Werner Lauener, of Lauterbrunnen, Karl Graf, and Hans Gertsch of Wengen. [A.T.S.]

Three Zurich climbers, R. Gossweiler and the brothers Ehrlich were overtaken by a landslide on their way to the Kroente hut in the Spannort group and were killed outright. [A.T.S.]

Walter Sturzenegger (aged 19) of Küssnacht (Ct. Zurich) was killed by lightning on the ascent of the Wildhorn, and his companion was badly burnt.

Two masked men entered the station building at Pieterlen, (Ct. Berne), and threatened the booking clerk with revolvers. They then rifled the safe and decamped — by motor car. The police were warned, but so far no arrests have been effected. [A.T.S.]

The Italian Ambassador in Berne, Monsieur M. Coppini, has paid a visit to a large watch manufacturing concern in Tavannes. He was accompanied by M. Moine, a member of the Government of the canton of Berne. [A.T.S.]

After a luncheon offered to the distinguished guest, a visit was paid to the municipal art museum, and the Jesuit cathedral. At the Schoenbühl home for old people, Mrs. Ottilie Rohr-Brändli, the oldest inhabitant of the town and canton Schaffhausen, has celebrated her 101st birthday. [A.T.S.]

A serious motoring accident occurred on the Zurich-Berne Road, near Lenzburg, when a small car ran into a stationary lorry. Dr. Heinz Hauer (aged 53) chemist of Zurich, and his wife Paula (aged 52) were killed. [A.T.S.]

The "Pavillon de Montreux", the new concert hall, with seating accommodation for 1,200, and stage room for 100 musicians and singers, was opened recently in the presence of a number of guests, amongst them Federal Councillor Chaudet, the French and West German Consul General, and M. Maret, President of the Government of the canton of Vaud.

On the occasion of the 102nd birthday of Mme. Elisa Regamey-Delessert of Forel (Ct. Vaud) the Prefect of Lavaux, the President of the commune of Forel, and the Pastor of Savigny paid a visit to the "Jubilarin" presenting their congratulations.

Three Swiss frontier guards were sentenced at Geneva for stealing thousands of francs worth of watches, clothes, perfumes and other articles from Customs depots at Geneva Airport in 1954 and 1955.

Dr. Leo Billeter, a well-known personality in the canton of Neuchâtel, and a former member of the Grand Council, in Neuchâtel.

Dr. Charles Kinzelbach, since 1943, a member of the Board of the Ludwig von Roll'schen Eisenwerke, A.G., in Solothurn, at the age of 76. Dr. Gotthold Oderbolz, Head of the "Algemeinen Armenpflege" Basle, in Basle aged 56.

Mme. Christine Jenny-Jenny, the oldest inhabitant of the canton of Glarus, in Ennenda, aged 102.

There were 17,500 accidents on Swiss roads in the first half of 1956, compared with about 17,000 the previous year.
