NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

The death has taken place in the Anglo-Swiss Hospital in Cairo, after an operation, of Monsieur André Boissier, the Swiss Minister to Egypt. He was 52.

Born in Paris, he came of a well-known Genevan family, and it was in that city that he first studied, later going to Cambridge and Paris, and finally took his degree in law. He entered the Swiss Diplomatic service in 1942, and served for the next five years in Washington. For two years he was chief of protocol in Berne, and then in 1951, returned to the United States as 1st Counsellor of Legation. In 1954 he was appointed Minister in Cairo.

The Boissier family has given many eminent servants to the public, cultural and scholastic life of Geneva. The late Minister was a cousin of Professor Leopold Boissier, Chairman of the International Red Cross Committee.

What is probably the world's smallest regular army as well as its oldest, the Swiss Guard at the Vatican, recently celebrated its 450th anniversary by military ceremonies with pipes and drums, and a parade in its traditional yellow, orange, and dark blue striped uniforms — reputed to have been designed by Michael Angelo or Raphael. For the occasion they also wore their heavy medieval armour, instead of the lighter armour customarily used.

The origins of the guard go back to the fourteenth century, when a number of Swiss and other foreign mercenaries took service with the reigning Pope. But, apart from occasional references to the recruitment of Swiss mercenaries, little is known of its history until 1505, when Pope Julius II decided to establish a permanent Swiss corps for the personal protection of the Pope and the papal palaces — a function which, with the addition of certain police functions laid down in the Lateran Treaty of 1929, it still fulfils.

The regular foundation of the guard, therefore, dates from January 21, 1506, when 150 Swiss soldiers, led by Peter von Hertenstein, arrived in Rome and were given the solemn blessing of the Pope in St. Peter's Square. Twenty-one years later the guard was almost wiped out in the sack of Rome.

It is on the anniversary of this event each year that new recruits take their traditional oath to "serve faithfully the reigning Pontiff and his legitimate successors or, in periods when the throne is vacant, the Sacred College of Cardinals". Recently, when the anniversary celebrations were held in conjunction with the oath-taking ceremony, there were 21 new recruits from 10 Swiss cantons, bringing the strength of the guard to 83. The captain commandant is Colonel Baron Heinrich de Pfyffer d'Altishofen, the 27th commander since the corps was established.

Before the ceremony, and the laying of a wreath on the memorial in the Vatican of the 147 Swiss guards who were killed in the sack of Rome, the

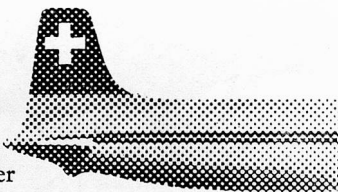
