NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

Dr. H. Streuli, President of the Swiss Confederation, has sent a telegram of condolence to King Olav V of Norway

on the occasion of the death of King Haakon VIII.

Monsieur Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister, accompanied by Minister Robert Kohli, head of the Division for Political Affairs and General Secretary of the Federal Political Department, called at the Norwegian Embassy in Berne to express, on behalf of the Federal Council and the Swiss people, their sympathy.

Switzerland is ready to provide a meeting-place for a world-wide conference on the effects of radio-activity released by nuclear explosions. The Swiss Government announced that when the time came for scientists to meet and discuss the problem it "will be ready to receive and organise the conference in a Swiss

Monsieur Jan Obhidal, the newly appointed Minister Plenipotentiary and Envoy Extraordinary of the Republic of Czecho-Slovakia, has presented his credentials to Dr. H. Streuli, President of the Swiss Confederation, and Monsieur Max Petitpierre, Swiss Foreign Minister, at the Palais Fédéral in Berne.

The receipts of the Federal Customs Administration for the month of August 1957 amounted to 78.7 million francs, of which the Confederation receives 54.4 million francs or 1.4 million francs less than during the same period in 1956.

The receipts for the first eight months of the current year total 470.8 million francs, which is 39.8 million francs more than in 1956.

King Saud of Saudi-Arabia, with a suite numbering 32 persons, at the end of last month arrived at the Cointrin airport (Geneva). On alighting from the plane he was greeted by M. Jacques Mallet,

Assistant Chef du Protocole, on behalf of the Federal Council, and by officials of the town of Geneva. The visitors later on travelled by car to Ouchy, where they made a stay.

M. Césare Lucchini, a former General Manager of the Swiss Federal Railways, received the insignia of an officer of the "Légion d'Honneur" from the French Consul-General on behalf of the French President.

The population of the town of Winterthur on August 31st 1957 numbered 77,037. (88.9 per cent Swiss and 11.81 per cent foreigners). [A.T.S.]

A burglar entered the premises of "Strebel-Muth, A.G.", tobacconists, at the Morgartenstrasse Lucerne, and stole an amount of 1,500.— francs from the till.

A motor-car collided with an express train at a level-crossing near Ebikon (Ct. Lucerne). The driver of the car, Alois Kuettel (55), of Ebikon, father of 14 children, was killed instantly. [A.T.S.]

Mr. Eduard Binkert, at present Director of the electric power station Lucerne, has been elected in the same capacity to the electric power station in Berne in succession to Mr. H. Jaecklin, who is retiring. [A.T.S.]

A monument executed by the Fribourg sculptor Antoine Claraz, in memory of the popular folk-lore composer Abbé Joseph Bovet, was unveiled at Bulle (Ct. Fribourg) amidst great enthusiasm. A colourful procession, in which over 3,000 persons and 40 bands took part, paraded through the gaily decorated streets of the town of Bulle to the monument, before which Dr. Pierre Glasson, President of the Government of the canton of Fribourg, delivered a speech in which he eulogised the work of the popular composer.

Corporal Stalder of Riehen, when on leave from the "Aspirantenschule" in Appenzell, was handling a revolver in the kitchen of the parental home; and being under the impression that the weapon was unloaded pulled the trigger. Miss Frieda Boller, a district nurse of Jona near Rapperswil (Ct. St. Gall), was run over by a motorcar when cycling. She succumbed to her injuries.

A motor-cyclist collided with a motor-car at Münsterlingen (Ct. Thurgau). The wife of the motor-cyclist, Mrs. Maria Haag-Bauhofer (29), of Altnau, was killed, and her husband received serious injuries.

A monument designed by the sculptor Renno Rossi to the memory of the late Federal-Councillor Giuseppe Motta was unveiled in Bellinzona in the presence of over 5,000 persons, amongst them Federal-Councillor Lepori, the members of the Government of the canton of Ticini in corpore, members of the Grand Council of the canton of Ticino, Members of Parliament

representing the canton in the Federal Chambers, representatives of the Federal Supreme Court and the churches, and delegations of the cantonal and communal authorities. The sons of the late Federal-Councillor Motta, Riccardo, Sigismondo and Christopher, with their families, attended the ceremony.

Speeches were made by the former Federal-Councillor Enrico Celio, M. Tatti, Mayor of the town of Bellinzona, M. Nello Celio, President of the Government of the canton of Ticino, and by Federal-

Councillor G. Lepori. [A.T.S.]

A serious traffic accident occurred on the road between La Tour-de-Peilz and Clarens when three cars were involved in a collision. One person was killed and four seriously hurt. The victim was Mme. Selz, of La Chaux-de-Fonds. [A.T.S.]

At a creditors' meeting of the firm "Baumgartner & Cie., S.A.", paper merchants of Lausanne, it was decided to recommend the management of the firm to transfer the business to a new company, to which they agreed. The firm will be known in future under the name "Baumgartner Papiers S.A."

It was announced that the Banks which sustained heavy losses through the presenting of incorrect balance sheets have issued a writ through their legal representatives against Pierre Baumgartner. [A.T.S.]

The 38th "Comptoir Suisse" Lausanne closed its doors on the 22nd of last month; over 800,000 visitors

went through the turnstiles.

means of protection against hailstorms. The institute is now concentrating on that study and it believes that the examination of abnormal hailstones can contribute to the solution of the problem.

Good news for motorists. The Swiss authorities are now preparing plans which they expect to be introduced at the beginning of 1958.

Depuis nombre d'années, la Semaine suisse s'efforce de lutter contre l'utilisation abusive des emblèmes nationaux et d'autres signes publics suisses sur les marchandises offertes aux consommateurs. On sait qu'un produit d'origine étrangère se vend plus facilement en Suisse lorsqu'il est muni d'une croix fédérale, d'un écusson cantonal, de l'image de Guillaume Tell ou d'une région connue de notre pays. Cette action de la Semaine suisse est trop souvent freinée par l'effet d'une législation peu claire et que les tribunaux appliquent dans un sens très large. Il faudrait à ce propos consacrer des pages entières au cas particulier des "articles-souvenirs", qui très souvent nous arrivent directement de l'étranger, ornés d'une croix helvétique.

D'autres marchandises parviennent sur le marché suisse avec des noms de fantaisie, sans indication de provenance et sans que soit connu le fabricant.

Dans de tels cas, la curiosité de l'acheteuse ou de l'acheteur sera bienfaisante. Certes, le commerce international est basé sur la réciprocité et il ne viendra à l'idée de personne de renoncer par principe à l'achat d'une marchandise parce qu'elle est étrangère au pays. En revanche, chaque consommateur a le droit d'être renseigné honnêtement sur la provenance du produit qu'on lui offre. Ainsi, il n'achètera pas à l'aveuglette. Il sera d'autre part absolument certain de l'origine suisse d'un produit, si celui-ci porte la marque de l'" Arbalète ", que le Bureau central pour la marque suisse d'origine a créé il y a 25 ans et qui sera présente le mois prochain dans les milliers de vitrines que préparent les détaillants avec les bons produits de chez nous.
