NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

The Queen has approved the appointment of Sir William Montagu-Pollock, now British Ambassador in Lima, to be Ambassador in Berne in succession to Sir Lionel Lamb, who is soon to retire from the Foreign Service. Before going to Peru, Sir William Montagu-Pollock was British Ambassador in Damascus. Sir Lionel Lamb served for many years in China before his appointment in Berne.

The Swiss Federal Railways have carried 17.0 million passengers in the month of November 1957, or 600,000 more than in November 1956. Receipts 22.3 million francs. (Nov. 1956: 21.5 million francs.)

Goods traffic is returned as 2.15 million tons, or 200,000 tons less than during the same period in 1956. Receipts: 41.1 million francs. (Nov. 1956: 44.9 million francs.)

The following deaths are reported from Switzerland:

Arnold Brenni, architect, in Berne at the age of 69. The deceased held an important post in the Federal Post, Telegraph and Telephone administration from 1928 to 1953. In the army, he held the rank of Colonel (Engineering Corps).

Charles Nicolet, Secretary of the "Verbandes der Handels-Transport & Lebensmittelarbeiter", in Broc aged 58.

Alfred Ramseyer, at one time "Stadtbaumeister" of Herisau, and from 1918 to 1949, head of the "Hochbau Bureau" of the Swiss Federal Railways, in Lucerne at the age of 73.

Hans von Gunten, a former Town Engineer of Berne, in Berne aged 63. He was "Geniechef" of the second division with the rank of Colonel.

Leonce Duruz, for 25 years Prefect of the Broye district, in Estavayer-Le-Lac at the age of 52. The deceased held the post of President of the Tribunal of the 2nd division with the rank of Colonel.


Adrien Jaquerod, formerly Professor and Director of the Physical Institute of the University of Neuchâtel, in Neuchâtel aged 81.

Hans Erhardt, from 1928 to 1948, Director of the Paper Works Serrières, and afterwards a member of the Board of this concern, in Neuchâtel at the age of 86.

Louis Hoffmeyer, formerly President of the commune of Bassecourt, in Bassecourt aged 73.

Professor Dr. jur. August Simonius, *Ordinarius* for Roman law at the University of Basle, in Basle at the aged of 73.

Mme. Bertha Hodler — widow of the eminent painter Ferdinand Hodler, who died in 1918 — in Geneva at the age of 80.

Peter Aliesch, for many years "Landamann" of the Schiers district, in Schiers aged 77.

Professor Dr. h.c. Hans Hofmann, in Zurich at the age of 61. The deceased was from 1936 to 1939, chief architect of the "Landesausstellung" Zurich, and until his death Professor at the Federal Institute of Technology (ETH) Zurich. (Architecture). In 1941, the University of Zurich honoured him with the degree of *doctor honoris causa*.

Ernst Heiniger, a former teacher of gymnastics, and during 20 years editor of the "Schützen Zeitung", in Aarau aged 80.

Hans Keller, from 1906 to 1943, a teacher at the "Technikum" Bienne, in Bienne at the age of 81.

Professor Dr. Arnold Reymond, in Lausanne at the age of 84. The deceased studied theology at the University of Lausanne, philosophy and natural science at the Universities of Basle, Berlin, London and Paris. In 1912, he became Professor of philosophy at the Neuchâtel University, and in 1925, he was appointed *ordinarius* of the philosophical faculty of the Lausanne University. Thirteen years afterwards (1938) he became Director of the Institute for social science at the Lausanne University. Professor Reymond retired in 1939. He is the author of a great number of scientific works. The Universities of Paris, Marseilles, Aix and Montpellier honoured him with the degree of *doctor honoris causa*. In 1939, the comune of Pully made him an honorary citizen.

François Roch, President of the Board of the newspaper "Courrier" published in Geneva, in Grand-Lancy, aged 51.

Emil Schill, well-known landscape Painter, in Kerns at the age of 88.

Ernst Christoph Sartorius, for many years Secretary of "Weltbundes der Christlichen Vereine junger Männer" (Y.M.C.A.), in Geneva aged 87.

Hugo Bein, from 1928 to 1946, Administrator of the orphanage of Basle, in Basle at the age of 72.

Brigade Colonel Léon Collaud, from 1941 to 1946, "Oberpferdearzt" of the Swiss army, in Kreuzlingen at the age of 75. The deceased was a member of the Grand Council of the canton of Thurgau, and President of the District Court Diessenhofen.

Mme. E. Wocher-Wey, in Lucerne aged 71. She was the authoress of a great number of children's books using the pseudonym of Ilse Wey.

Engelbert Wuerth, since 1954, "Kreispostdirektor" (St. Gall) in St. Gall at the age of 65.

Franz Gasser, from 1938 to 1946, a member of the Government of the canton of Obwalden, and afterwards President of the Board of the "Holzbau A.G." Lungern, in Lungern aged 69. [A.T.S.]
