NEWS AT RANDOM

Federal

The Swiss and Israeli Governments have decided to raise their respective Legations in Berne and Tel Aviv to

the status of Embassy.

The Federal Council has appointed Monsieur Emil Bisang to the post of Ambassador in Israel, in succession to Minister Schnyder, who has been recently appointed as Observer at the United Nations head-quarters in New York.

Ambassador Bisang was born in Geneva in 1900 and is a citizen of Ettiswil (Ct. Lucerne); he entered the Diplomatic Service in 1929 and successively held posts in Lyons, Sidney and Melbourne. In 1940 he was appointed Attaché at the Swiss Legation at The Hague, and afterwards was head of the American and Japanese section (Foreign Interests) in Berne.

In 1945 Monsieur Bisang was promoted to the rank of Counsellor of Legation and sent to Washington. Two years later (1947) he was nominated 1st Counsellor of Legation at Ottawa, and in 1954 he took over the direction of the Swiss Legation in Karachi with the rank of Chargé d'Affaires. In 1955 he was appointed Swiss Minister in Pakistan.

The Swiss Consulate in Leopoldsville (Belgian Congo) has been raised to the status of a Consulate-General, and Monsieur Th. Curchod has been promoted to the rank of Consul-General.

Counsellor of Legation Monsieur André Dominicé will shortly relinquish his post as head of the Swiss Delegation to the Neutral Nations Commission for the Repatriation of Prisoners of War in Korea. He will be succeeded by Counsellor of Legation Monsieur Edmond Deslex.

The Federal Council has fixed the poll for the Federal Finance Reform ("Bundesfinanzordnung") to take place on May 11th 1958.

The King and Queen of Greece will pay an official visit to the Federal Council from 10th to 12th September of this year.

During the month of December 1957 the Swiss Federal Railways have carried 18.6 million passengers, or 600,000 more than in December 1956. Receipts: 27.9 million francs (December 1956: 27 million francs).

Goods traffic is returned as 1.88 million tons, or 250,000 tons less than in December 1956. Receipts: 38.5 million francs.

The Federal Council has elected Mr. Walter Baumann to the post of Vice-Director of the Federal Finance Control.

Cantonal

The accounts for 1957 of the canton of Zurich close with a credit balance of 12,633,349.— francs. [A.T.S.]

During the year 1957, 1,827 traffic accidents (1956: 1,704) occurred in the canton of Basle-Town. 1,378 persons were injured (1956: 1,267). 23 persons succumbed to their injuries (1956: 16). [A.T.S.]

The collection on behalf of the village of Peiden-Schuders (Ct. Grisons), which suffered heavy damage through flood and fire in 1957, totalled 315,785 francs. A.T.S.

The 4½ per cent loan of the "Nordostschweizerischen Kraftwerke A.G." Baden was heavily oversubscribed, and allocations had to be considerably reduced. [A.T.S.]

Mr. Karl Alfons Deisenroth, Kurdirektor of Bad Ragaz (Ct. Grisons), has tendered his resignation.

Mademoiselle Alzire Robert of Chardonne (Ct. Vaud) has celebrated her 100th birthday; she was for many years a teacher of French in the United States of America.

The canton of Vaud numbers at present three inhabitants who are over 100 years of age. They are: Mme. Vuichond of Montreux, born 1855; Mlle. A. Robert, born in 1858; and Mlle. Elise Graz of Jogny, born 1858. [A.T.S.]
