For the last five or six years similar losses have been graciously met by a few members of the Committee who felt that the prestige of the Fête Suisse and the good it did were well worth while.

Mr. Alfred Renou writes:

Since our last meeting great efforts have been made by those entrusted with the task of finding out what could be done. Unfortunately it has been found absolutely impossible to get a large hall with catering possibilities for a suitable date this year, but we have provisionally reserved the Central Hall with its catering facilities for the last Thursday in March or the first in April, 1962, and further details will be published as soon as the General Committee has met. Meanwhile I have received very encouraging support from Madame Sophie Wyss and others and if further support is forthcoming I am sure that the Fête Suisse will take place with renewed success next year.
