St. Gall region when warm milk cures were the fashion

For a long time it was believed that milk, drunk just after milking, held miraculous healing properties. In eastern Switzerland, above all, this treatment had become a speciality, and, only a hundred years ago, Gais and Heiden were names as well known as the most famous tourist centres of today. They were the meeting-places for the whole of Europe.

At the New Museum of St. Gall one may currently visit an exhibition showing the development of tourism in the region of Mount Säntis. One can admire all sorts of picturesque documents and engravings illustrating this corner of Switzerland, a countryside made for rest, relaxation and health, becoming during the past thirty years, little by little, as popular as it used to be in the last century.
