PIANO RECITAL**Ruth Huggenberg**

Ruth Huggenberg, the well-known Swiss pianist, gave a recital on Saturday, 2nd March, at Wigmore Hall, London W.1.

The programme which she had chosen consisted of Six Variations on an Original Theme in F major, Op. 34, by Beethoven, Sonata in B flat major, Op. Posth., by Schubert, Ireland's Sonata in E minor, and Brahms's Vier Klavierstücke, Op. 119.

Miss Huggenberg's rendering of Beethoven's Six Variations showed that she is a genuine musical player. In the Vier Klavierstücke, by Brahms, she gave us real pleasure; her playing had authority and her refined interpretation, especially in the B minor intermezzo, proved that she is a very capable artiste with plenty of musical feeling. Ireland's Sonata in E minor was played with strength, assurance and well-balanced musicianship. The Sonata in E Minor by Schubert was rendered with poetry and grace. All in all an enjoyable evening.
