We deeply regret to announce the death of Mr. George Bruschweiler, P.A.G.S.B., L.G.R., of "Earlsmere", Chertsey Lane, Staines, Surrey. He died on 15th April, aged 75. He was well-known in the West End of London as a master butcher. He took over his father's business in Charlotte Street (established in 1887) in 1922. He served in the British Forces from 1915-1919, being a dual national.

Mr. Bruschweiler was known as a great and generous supporter of the Swiss Club in Charlotte Street. He was also the initiator of the Lucullus Lodge in 1931 and a Joining Member of Staines Lodge. Another Swiss Club he supported was the Male Choir.

We express our sincere sympathy to his widow and his brother in their sad bereavement.

SWITZERLAND'S "YOUNG RESEARCH WORKERS" FORM AN ASSOCIATION

With a view to taking an active part in the advancement of research in Switzerland, several hundred young research workers in this country founded a Swiss Association of Young Research Workers. This group is open to all research workers in the moral and exact sciences who have completed their studies and carried out a number of original research projects; four-fifths of the members must be under 45 years of age, their elder becoming "old members". Recently, the young research workers made their programme known to Swiss public opinion. They demand above all a reform of the university system, by modernising its structure and switching from an authoritarian professorship to teaching, better scientific co-ordination and the possibility of taking part in the study of the development of existing research centres and the creation of new centres, so as to prevent the scattering of forces and redundancy. The young research workers wish to intensify their professional contacts and are considering the creation of an "index of Swiss research workers", enabling each member to gain a better idea of what the others are doing.
