FROM MOUNTAIN VILLAGE TO MODERN RESORT

A new resort is currently being created in the Val d'Anniviers, in Canton Valais, in sight of some of Switzerland's most grandiose mountains. Its name is Zinal. The last Baedeker Guide wrote of it: "Situated at the end of a glacier-enclosed valley . . . not accessible by automobile". But today it is the scene of some of the most intense construction in South-Western Switzerland. Frédéric Tissot, Vice-President of the Swiss Tourist Association, has termed Project Zinal "bold but realistic". Starting with a capitalisation of two and a half million francs, the Company for the Touristic Expansion of Zinal intends to convert the mountain village to a popular resort within the year. Hotels are being built with a total of 440 beds, as well as sports facilities, chalets, a cablecar, three lifts and a new access road. Reachable via Sierre, situated 23 miles (38 km.) from Brig, the new holiday centre is due to be opened in the autumn.
