**POETRY READING BY JEAN BER.**

Introduced by the Cultural Attaché of the Swiss Embassy, the actor and broadcaster Jean Ber, well known for his poetry readings in Switzerland and many other European countries, made his first London appearance on 14th May under the Joint auspices of the **Anglo-Swiss Society** and the **Nouvelle Société Helvétique**. The first part of his programme consisted entirely of texts by French-Swiss writers, among which extracts from works by C. F. Ramuz were given a particularly evocative rendering. The very responsive audience equally enjoyed *Bestiaire d'humour*, an anthology of light-hearted French poems satirizing human weaknesses in animal disguise.

Jean Ber's impressive performance provided an appropriate setting for the launching of a special issue on C. F. Ramuz of the literary magazine "Adam". Under the expert editorship of Mr. Miron Grindea, British, American, French and Swiss authors joined forces to produce a collective work of literary criticism which will greatly contribute to better knowledge of the eminent Vaudois writer in this country and the English-speaking world at large.

Both M. Ber's London visit and the publication of the "Adam" number on Ramuz have been facilitated by financial support from the "Pro Helvetia" Foundation.
