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His presence there would no doubt have been warmly welcomed. His memory remains alive in one salon at least: that of the Bernese lady, Maria Grossholz, who became Madame Tussaud and who, in her famous museum in London, placed his wax effigy modelled from life<sup>40</sup> in the tableau of King Louis XVI and his family, where we can still contemplate his witty face and his searching gaze. One of his visitors there will surely have been Mr. E. V. Rieu, of Geneva, Editor of the Penguin Classics in London, 1944-64, who is the great-great-grandson of Henri Rieu, of Geneva (1721-87), one of Voltaire's *confidants* and *agents d'affaires*.
