First Exhibition

Prophets are not much worth in their home-country. This old saying compels many young Swiss artists to try their luck abroad. Baden-born painter Benno Zehnder who has been working as a graphic designer with the Swiss Centre for more than three years had his first exhibition in this country at 42, Queensdale Road, W. 11. From 17th-31st May he showed paintings, drawings and "experiments", the latter being wire-nettings in different colours with which he breaks light in a way so that peculiar shapes can be observed.

His paintings in oil or emulsion are mostly created out of impulses and reflect moods, feelings, states of mind. They sometimes give away the idea that graphic are stood at the origin; nevertheless they are very decorative and some of them reach a density of expression which point to a promising future for the young artist.

SWISS CONSIGNMENT FOR SWEDEN

The "Oskarhamnsverkets Kraftgrupp AG", which has been commissioned to build the first nuclear power station in Sweden, has decided to add to the first group of steam turbines a second group developing 600 MW. It was the firm of Brown, Boveri & Co., at Baden, that was awarded the order for the generator, the group of turbines being scheduled to go into operation in the course of 1974.


