Mr. Olivier Béguin died on 1st April, aged 58, at the Westminster Hospital, London. The cremation ceremony took place at the West London Crematorium before an attendance of colleagues and representatives from the Swiss Colony. He will be buried at the St. George Cemetery in Geneva, where his parents rest.

Mr. Béguin was well known in the London Colony, particularly for his involvement with the Swiss Church. He was President of the Consistoire for fourteen years and resigned only at the end of last year, realising that his illness would not allow him to carry out his duties much longer. He was, for a couple of years, President of the Federation of Swiss Societies in the U.K. It was during his Presidency of the Consistoire that the Swiss Church launched its bi-centenary appeal. The life of the Swiss churches in London was to undergo many other changes during these fourteen years.

Mr. Béguin came to London in 1949 as the General Secretary of the newly-created United Bible Society, an organisation which he has built up as a co-ordinating body responsible for the world-wide production, distribu-tion and translation of the Document underlying the Christian faith; an organisation serving to co-ordinate the work of some fifty bible societies across the world. In this capacity, he was called to travel unceasingly and earned the nickname of "Swiss Globetrotter" in his professional circle. He was highly involved in the renewed interest of the Roman Catholic Church in the Bible, and has written a book on the subject. He was also concerned with ecumenical translations and, naturally, with the many new paperback editions of the Scriptures in a modern, everyday language accessible to the ordinary man.

In 1963, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate in Humanities from the University of Tokyo. The

Archbishop of York, Dr. Donald Coggan, dedicated him his book "Word and World".

Born at Le Locle in 1914, son of a watchmaker, Mr. Béguin studied at the Secondary School at Neuchatel and later at the Literature Faculty in Geneva, intending to become a Latin and French teacher. His teaching career was curtailed by the war and a three year period as Sergeant Major. Later he worked for prisoners-of-war with the newly-founded World Council of Churches.

He leaves a widow, Agnes, and three children: Pierre-Michel, Jean-Géza and Anne.
