GLORIA VANOLI AT FENTON HOUSE

The distinguished young Swiss harpsichordist Gloria Vanoli, having given the pre-Christmas party of the Nouvelle Societe Helvetique a tantalising foretaste of her great artistry, subsequently gave a public recital in London before returning to Switzerland. Most fittingly it took place at Fenton House in Hampstead, the well-known home of old music and instruments where lovers of the arts of ages past congregate on occasions from all over the world. There within the wooden panelling of walls and ceiling and floor, Miss Vanoli's delicate performance on the harpsichord gained a natural warmth and

immediacy of appeal that could not be bettered in any modern concert hall.

Miss Vanoli's programme was as richly varied as anyone could wish, comprising apart from a delicious selection of works of the 17th and 18th century also some charmingly witty pieces by Bela Bartok of our times. She started with a brilliant rendering of J.S. Bach's Overture Francaise, one of his most exacting harpsichord compositions. Then followed John Bull's dramatic "King's Hunt" from the Fitzwilliam Virginal Book, Padre A. Soler's Sonata in F, Domenico Scarlatti's short Sonata in F, Bela Bartok's "From the Diary of a Fly" and three Roumanian folk-dances, Francois Couperin's "La Convalescente", "La Sophie", "La Pantomime" and "Le tic-toc-choc ou Les Maillotins", and the programme ended with J.-Ph. Rameau's "Les Niais de Sologne".

To comment in detail on Miss Vanoli's masterly rendering of her most exciting programme would require a specialist's knowledge your reviewer cannot boast of. He must content himself with the statement that every item offered by this ambitious yet modest young artist was warmly applauded. Switzerland has every reason to be proud of this new talent and it is to be hoped that London and our Colony may see and here more of Miss Vanoli in the not too distant future.
