ROMAINMOTIER ABBEY

The Church of Romainmotier, in the Orbe district of Canton Vaud, is dedicated to Saint Peter. It is the ancient church of an important monastery of remarkable proportions, famed in the middle ages and one of the oldest churches of Switzerland. It forms a Latin cross, with three naves, one transept and a choir. Its architecture follows in essence the Roman style of the Order of Cluny. Several parts of the edifice date from the 10th and the 11th centuries.

At the beginning of the 14th century, the choir was transformed and ornamented with a Gothic window. The vast *narthex* (long vestibule) preceded by a Gothic porch, is also one of the most remarkable features of this church.

The tower rises above the centre of the transept. Its low body is surmounted by a slender spire.

The church contains many sculptures, representing mainly religious figures. Particularly worthy of attention in the choir is the Monument of the Prior Jean de Seyssel.

This venerable church has undergone important renovation work during the past few years.

Situated in the lower part of the town, the Convent on which the church of Romainmotier once depended, was enclosed within wall which have mostly disappeared today. Several of its towers have been demolished. Lying on the banks of the river Nozon and visible within the enclosure is an imposing castle which probably served as residence to priors and visitors to the convent, whose cloister was situated between the castle and the church. The cloister was demolished at the time of the Reformation.

According to tradition, the convent was founded by Saint Romain, a native of Franche-Comté, under the pontificate of Innocent I. In 753, the Pope Etienne II consecrated the church under the patronage of Saint Peter and Saint Paul. He gave the monastery the name of *Romanum*

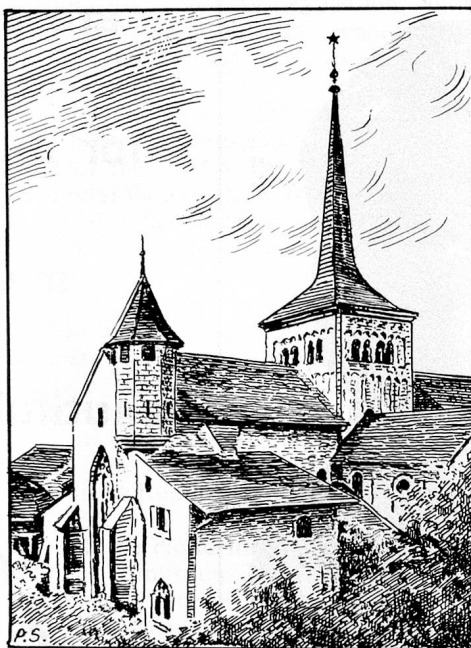
During the Bernese conquest of 1536, the convent placed itself under the protection of the Lords of Fribourg. But despite their efforts and long negotiations, they had to disclaim their protectorate over the convent for a share of the plunders... Berne took the rest.

Some of the monks accepted the Reformation. Others left for Franche-Comté. The Grandson reformer Jean le Comté held pastoral functions at the convent from 1554 to 1567.

Romainmôtier then became the chief town of a bailiwick whose first bailiff was Adrien of Bubenberg. To this bailiwick was annexed the Abbey of Lake Joux (1566), of which there is nothing left except the ancient tower. It is the tower of the actual church.

In 1589, Romainmôtier received the status of a city, and on 27th January 1798, when the Revolution had swept into western Switzerland, declared itself free from Berne and joined the Lemanic Republic.
