His command of languages was of the utmost help to him in this respect.

The peak of his career came during the late war when, as a director of an important city confirming house, he developed a large business with the French and Belgian Colonies in Equatorial Africa and Madagascar, acting as buying agent for local importers cut off from their usual suppliers by the German occupation of Europe. He travelled extensively in these territories.

He was a keen Freemason, being a member of the L'Entente Cordiale, Lodge No. 2796. He loved life in general and friends will remember his indomitable spirit. His open-heartedness and generosity helped many in times of need. Outside interests included philately and an interest in nature.

On retiring from the City in about 1965, he lived either in the New Forest, or in his villa at Fuengirola in Spain.

He leaves a widow, a daughter and a son.
