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A profile of Andri Peer

Born in the Engadine in 1921, Andri Peer studied at the Universities of Zürich and Paris and obtained a Doctor's degree in Romance studies in 1951. From 1952, he taught French and Italian at the Cantonal High School at Winterthur.

Although he has worked mainly in German-speaking Switzerland, Andri Peer is one of the outstanding poets and writers of contemporary Raeto-Romance literature.

He is also regarded as one of its foremost literary critics. Andri Peer has several volumes of poetry, some of collected essays, various collections of short-stories and radio plays to his credit, all written in the Raeto-Romance language. Since his student days, he has also shown a particular interest in the visual arts.

Andri Peer is a member of the Swiss National Commission for U.N.E.S.C.O. and Charman of its cultural section.

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
