Iselins were in New York. Then followed a period of four years in Cologne/Bonn and another stay in

Berne (1963-1969).

In 1969, Juerg and Elisabeth Iselin arrived in London where they soon became very popular members of the Swiss Community. Dr. Iselin advanced from Counsellor to Minister, and his wife helped the Ambassador, a bachelor, in the Embassy's representative and social life. This she did with great skill, and the many visitors enter-tained in the Iselins' lovely flat in Regent's Park remember with pleasure their generous hospitality. But Elisabeth Iselin also had time to take part in welfare work in the Colony, which was much appreciated.

In February 1975, Monsieur le Ministre and Madame Iselin returned to Berne and their beloved house at Zollikofen. Again, Elisabeth Iselin led an active life, taking on the function of a secretary of the "Groupe des Dames du Départe-ment Politique". In March last year, she had the first of several operations, and a time of great pain and suffering followed. But she carried it with great courage and faith right to the end.

Elisabeth Iselin's many friends will remember her with affection as a forthright person, with many interests, especially in sport, but above

all her happy, friendly nature and her ever-ready willingness to help. Their deep sympathy goes out to her husband, daughter and son-in-law in their great sorrow.
