SOCIETY AND SOCIAL SCENE

A prominent Swiss honoured in Manchester

A RECEPTION in honour of Dr. Rudolf Ernst Keller, professor of German language and medieval German literature at the University of Manchester since 1960, was held recently at the Goethe-Institut in Manchester.

Marking Dr Keller's retirement at the end of last year, the reception was given by the director of the Goethe-Institut Manchester, Mr Waldo Maass, in conjunction with the Modern Languages Association (Association of Teachers of German) and the German Department of the university.

Appreciation for Dr Keller's collaboration was expressed by Mr Maass, Mr David Blamires, the new head of the German Department of Manchester University, and Mr Donal Watson, Chief Inspector, Education Authorities, Bolton, for the Modern Languages Association.

Among the guests were Mr C. Glauser, the Swiss Consul General in Manchester, and Dr V.

von Arnim, the Federal German Consul General in Liverpool.

Professor Keller, a citizen of Winterthur, was educated at the Kantonsschule Winterthur and at the University of Zurich where he obtained his title of Dr Phil.

From 1944 to 1946 he taught at the Kantonsschule Winterthur, came to this country in 1946 and was assistant lecturer at Manchester University until 1949 and lecturer in German at the Royal Holloway College, University of London, from 1949 to 1952.

He returned to Manchester University in 1952, first as a senior lecturer (1952-1959), reader in German (1959-1960),

Henry Simon Professor of German Language (1961-1982), Dean of the Faculty of Arts (1968-1970), and Pro-Vice-Chancellor (1976-1979).

In 1981 Professor Keller was presented with the Goethe-Institut Gold Medal.

In addition to many articles published in learned periodicals, his publications include "Die Ellipse in der neuenglischen Sprache als semantisch-syntaktisches Problem", 1944; "Die Sprachen der Welt", 1955 (trans. Bodmer: The Loom of Language); "German Dialects, Phonology and Morphology with Selected Texts", 1961; "The German Language", 1978.
