AN exhibition of 60 paintings and watercolours by **Paul Klee** is now on show until *July 31* in Nottingham (Castle Museum), and later from *August 7 - September 18* in Oxford (Museum of Modern Art).

At the same time, a few other paintings by Paul Klee have been included in an exhibition entitled "Alive to it all", which had first been shown at the Serpentine Gallery in London in March, then moved on to Hull and can now be seen from *June 18 - July 24* in Sheffield (Graves Gallery).

Fred Siegenthaler lives and works in Muttensz. He first started to make handmade paper in 1968 and went on to produce paper for a number of artists including **Jasper Johns** and **Miro**. He runs his own studio/mill as an artist and papermaker.

Siegenthaler's work "Pietà" of handmade paper made from cotton linters has been included in an exhibition called "Paper as Image", which has started touring Britain. It can be seen from *July 9 - August 14* in Southampton (Art Gallery, Civic Centre).

Guy Desbiolles will take part in an exhibition on the evolution of holography, "Light Dimensions", which will be held until *September 10* at the National Centre of Photography in Bath.

Twenty eight years old, Guy Desbiolles studied chemistry and physics, specialising in laser spectroscopy.

He began his personal

research into holography in 1981 and quickly made his mark through his experimental association with LOBE in France.

The artist is currently teaching part-time and developing a teaching laboratory for holography.
