The *Kummerley & Frey Bahn-Karte Schweiz* is without doubt an essential companion to one's travels through Switzerland but, comprehensive though it is, three useful pieces of information are missing, indication of ownership, gauge and the presence of rack sections.

The *Swiss Lines Diagram*, produced by member Alan Snowden, fills this need. Covering the country on a single A4 sheet in black on white, it summarises information only to be found, with some difficulty, in several volumes too weighty to take with one on a journey.
