Towards the end of last year the consultation document for the next Swiss timetable, to be dated 10th June 2001 to 14th December 2002 (yes, the dates are correct), appeared on the Internet for the first time. This is presented in the same format as the books and any of the proposed railway or bus timetables can be accessed and printed. A link to this website is provided on our web pages, but for those who do not have Internet access I will be happy to print any table which you require (up to a maximum of two) in return for three 1st class stamps. All I need to know are the table numbers required which are the same as those used in the current edition.

In concluding my notes I would urge you if at all possible to attend the Spring Meet and Annual General Meeting at Altrincham on 17th March. This is the major social and business event in the Society calendar and is always an enjoyable day out which is rounded off by an excellent dinner. The Committee members are anxious to meet as many people as possible on the Friday evening and Saturday and will, as in previous years, be readily identifiable.
