SWITZERLAND IN THE NEWS

Switzerland has been in the news recently for reasons that are quite out of the ordinary.

Firstly: the terrible shooting in the Zug Regional Parliament. Not something I would normally mention but it is appropriate to extend our sympathies to those who have died or suffered as a result.

Secondly: the collapse of Swissair. Although the company has been in difficulties for some time I am not convinced that this was expected to be the outcome. As many of you will know Crossair was partly owned by Swissair, fortunately it did not go down with its parent and has indeed taken over much of the network. A recent Press Release has clarified the situation in that the Federal Government and other corporations have provided funding until the end of March 2002 enabling Crossair to integrate planes, staff and services into an extended network. A new Swiss airline will be recreated and over the course of the next few months the situation will be made clearer. I know that many of you used Swissair in the past; it would appear you can continue with confidence. Frequent Flyer Qualiflyer miles will also be honoured - very different to what was originally envisaged. The scenes at airports around the world after the initial collapse were for the Swiss unusual to say the least. I do realise that Swiss Express is primarily a railway magazine but many of us, for reasons of cost and convenience, myself included, fly to Switzerland rather than travel by train.

Thirdly: the tragedy in the Gotthard Tunnel, so reminiscent of the Mont Blanc disaster, albeit far better handled. More on this in the next issue. Finally and fourthly: the terrible accident at Zürich Airport when a Crossair flight crashed while landing. Once again our sympathies go out to those who suffered.

I mention all this, as sometimes we are apt to look upon Switzerland as being some kind of Utopia. The point is that Switzerland has its share of difficulties, accidents and tragedies just as we do.
