Cyril Freezer 1924 - 2009

As many members will be aware the well known writer on railway modelling issues Cyril Freezer sadly died in May. The Society was represented at his funeral by Geoffrey Higham and a floral tribute in the form of the Swiss national emblem was sent on behalf of the SRS. Along with editing Railway Modeller, then Model Railways, Cyril also edited Swiss Express for some years in the 1990s and was a long-serving member of the London Branch. A number of obituaries have appeared in various journals (including the *Daily Telegraph*) so rather than repeat similar words here I have asked Nick, one of his children and a regular contributor to Swiss *Express*, to put together some appropriate words about his late father. If you stay for at least two nights the cost is a minimal increase over that for 2009.

Swiss Express – Portfolio

It has been an ambition of the magazine's editorial team to produce a photo album showcasing some of the 1000s of digital images that are held in our photo archive. Although each edition of the magazine normally has well over 80 photographs mostly these are there to illustrate specific articles. We have many images that have been supplied on a more general basis and even though we have introduced a Photo Gallery section many of these may not get used. We have considered that this was a waste of the interesting images and the photographer's talent. To get these pictures into more general circulation the Management Committee has authorised the publication of a 44-page book that will be available in the autumn. This full colour publication, "Portfolio", will showcase several hundred images of both the major companies and a selection of the smaller operators. The book has been painstakingly put together by our Photo Editor Tony Bagwell who has worked with the contributors of the photographs to ensure that informative captions accompany each illustration. Membership

Martin Fisher, our hard working Membership Secretary, reports that at the end of June membership of the Society was 1255 (including 53 new members), slightly down on the figure at the same time last year of 1269. The overall position is encouraging, being little more than 1% down on the same point last year, despite subscription rates; with the country in the middle of a recession; and with the very poor exchange rate for overseas members. This probably means that we are doing something right. This continuing high level of membership allows us to produce Swiss Express to the high standard you have come to expect, so if you know of friends, relatives work colleagues, etc who are as interested in Switzerland and its transport system as we are why not encourage them to
