Layouts for the AGM **SWISS? not necessarily**

AGM organiser Roger Ellis writes – "You will see from the AGM details that we have a good number of layouts for the meeting but I can fit a few more into the accommodation we have reserved. I have committed a heinous crime in that one of them is Belgian HO! It is my belief that most members of the Society have an interest in railways in general and not just Swiss. In short, if you have a large or small railway or tram layout that you would like to bring give me the details and we'll try to find a space for it. However, if you would like to bring a display to the AGM I must know by the end of December as space in March will be at a premium".

Martin Fisher notes it is renewal time

"Another year has gone by and it's time to ask you to renew your SRS membership. Unless you have already paid for 2010 (in which case you should have received your new membership card already) you will find a renewal form inside this magazine. I look forward to receiving your completed form and payment as soon as possible. If you choose to pay by credit card rather than by

cheque please ensure that all the details are written clearly and are up-to-date.

More and more members pay for two years at once - a quarter of the membership did so in the last renewal round. This helps the SRS as it cuts down on the administrative work. If you choose to take up this option this time, I will send you your card for 2010 on renewal and the one for 2011 next autumn.

The subscriptions rate for UK-based members has remained at £15.00 for 2010. Unfortunately, due to the falling value of the pound against most other currencies and to forthcoming increases in overseas postage rates the Management Committee of the Society has reluctantly had to agree to an increase in subscriptions for members living outside the UK. The revised rate will be £20.00 for members living elsewhere in Europe; and £22.00 for members living in other parts of the world (USA members can alternatively pay by dollar cheque at \$44.00). If you are paying for 2-years, then double the amount in question."

Given that next year sees the 30th Anniversary of the founding of the SRS it is our intention to devote some space to a comprehensive review of our membership figures in the March magazine. Although currently membership numbers are good at 1272 we need you to renew, and also the Society would love to welcome new members. The more members there are the easier it will be for us to meet the increasing costs of running the SRS. Do you pass your *Swiss Express* on to interested friends or family? Why not suggest that to ensure their continued supply of the magazine these fine people join us. It is good value at only £15.
