The hand stamps were applied at the Purser's office on each vessel, the Purser's being only too happy to oblige. The postcards were then posted in the usual way and they had arrived back in the UK before we did!

From Jim Paterson – by email.

Having received SE 107 a few days after returning from our annual visit to Switzerland it was interesting note the

remarks about the Cadenazzo – Luino service on P30. These basically agreed with a printed pocket timetable of Locarno departures, but we found differently on Wednesday 17th August. Having purchased tickets to Luino from a machine we were unsure as to whether our onward connection from Cadenazzo would be by train or bus, however before reaching the platform we encountered a notice advising that the only service to Luino that day was by ship, due to road works in Italy. Deciding to abandon our trip rather than pay double for the ship we had no difficulty obtaining a refund for our train tickets. Also we were able to confirm that the rail replacement bus to Luino was only operating on certain days, but not on Wednesday (as suggested in SE), so it appeared that the roads authority in Lombardia was unconcerned about keeping trade away from a very large and busy market.

On the Arosa line, we found Allegra units powering heavier trains up the 6% gradient than we had seen previously. On several occasions, we noted trains consisting of the Allegra unit, three further passenger coaches, either an open coach or a DZ baggage van and up to four assorted freight vehicles. Such trains are longer than the passing loops, and have to pull in twice at the passing places, adding to the time taken for trains to cross. I was pleased to note that the new trains are fitted with the traditional high pitched whistle, and that "Allegra" is used as a greeting on the trains, both on the public address and the information screens. ☒

I thought “why not pick a mutually agreed time in 2012 and mention this to Society members in case any would like to join us?” The plan is that I will travel to Spiez on Saturday 9th June, probably staying at the Bellvue Hotel, and walk the BLS ramps on the Sunday and Monday. - The itinerary must include a timetabled stop at a minimum of one station in each of the 26 Cantons / Half Cantons. It is not necessary to get off in each Canton, but you cannot pass through without stopping. The start and finish stations can each count for their respective Canton.
- Either the 2011 or 2012 Kursbuch can be used.
- Entries should consist of the elapsed time together with a written itinerary noting the location/Canton stopping points.

Your entry, by either email or post, should be sent to the Editor (contact details on P3 of this magazine) to arrive no later than the 2nd January 2012.
