New people with new ideas are what are needed if the Society and its magazine are to go forward. Expect no immediate changes, we three will remain at our computers for a while yet, however, if you think there may be a role for you with the magazine in two years time, please get in touch with either me or John Jesson the Chairman. 🗖
