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
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The Fashion Display

at the Swiss Industries Fair, in Basel,
March 30 th - April 9 th 1940

The Swiss textile industry occupies an important section of the Swiss Industries Fair in Basle. The different branches of this industry are in a position not only to supply the home market, but also to meet the demands of the export trade.

This year, some of the products of the textile industry, such as embroideries, hold the place of honour in the Swiss Pavilion at the New York World's Fair, a place which was usually assigned to them at the Swiss Industries Fair in Basle. Nevertheless, the Textile Exposition Hall and the Fashion Display summarize in an excellent and interesting way the versatility of Swiss textile production. The qualities, which characterize all Swiss products, whether it be a marine chronometer or a delicate piece of lingerie or knitwear, are to be found here : the spirit of invention, the untiring search after new ideas, the careful perfection of detail — they are all made manifest once again in the textile section of the Fair in Basle.



Here, vaporous tulles spread the palette of their pastel hues. The rich variety of their texture, their many colours, plain or gaily printed, suggest many possibilities for all kinds of dresses, suitable for any occasion.

There, cool linen materials, checked and striped, rendered flexible and uncrushable by modern processes, make one visualize dresses and ensembles for hot summer days and tropical climates. In this group are also displayed designs of the home-spun type, so delightful for little aprons and smocks and even for fancy table linen.

Jersey and knitted fabrics are well to the fore, as is but right, because they are very much in vogue today, whether for underwear or for outer garments. Dresses, two-piece suits, blouses, perfect in style and cut, are made of these materials so smooth and supple that they have the appearance of lightweight woolen weaves. The models are trimmed with incrustations of contrasting colours or of cameo embroidery. Besides these novelties, classical styles and those suitable for sportswear are also displayed.

Knitwoven underwear is being constantly perfected. Particularly to be noted, is a new kind of charmeuse, unsurpassed for resisting countless launderings and even boilings, light and perspiration. The most elegant lingerie sets of pure silk, trimmed with

embroidery, are as strong in use as they are fragile in appearance. However, cosy underwear of wool or silk and wool mixture, classical in style, still has its partisans who have not been forgotten.

Many dress accessories are displayed, which lend an air of distinction and originality to any ensemble. Furs, for instance, and coquettish little hats, gloves of all colours, handbags, daringly printed scarves — and we had thought that there was nothing new to think of in this domain! — neckties inspired by events of the day and even beauty products, those indispensable accessories of fashion.
