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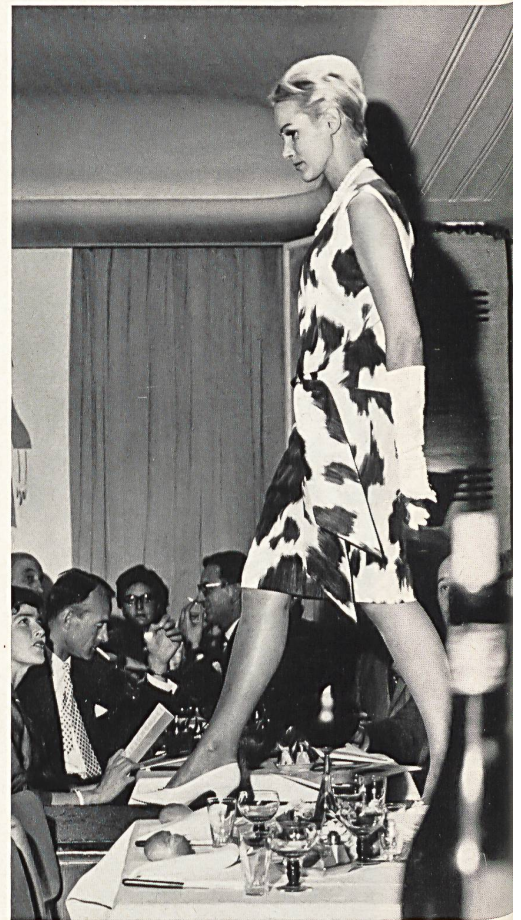
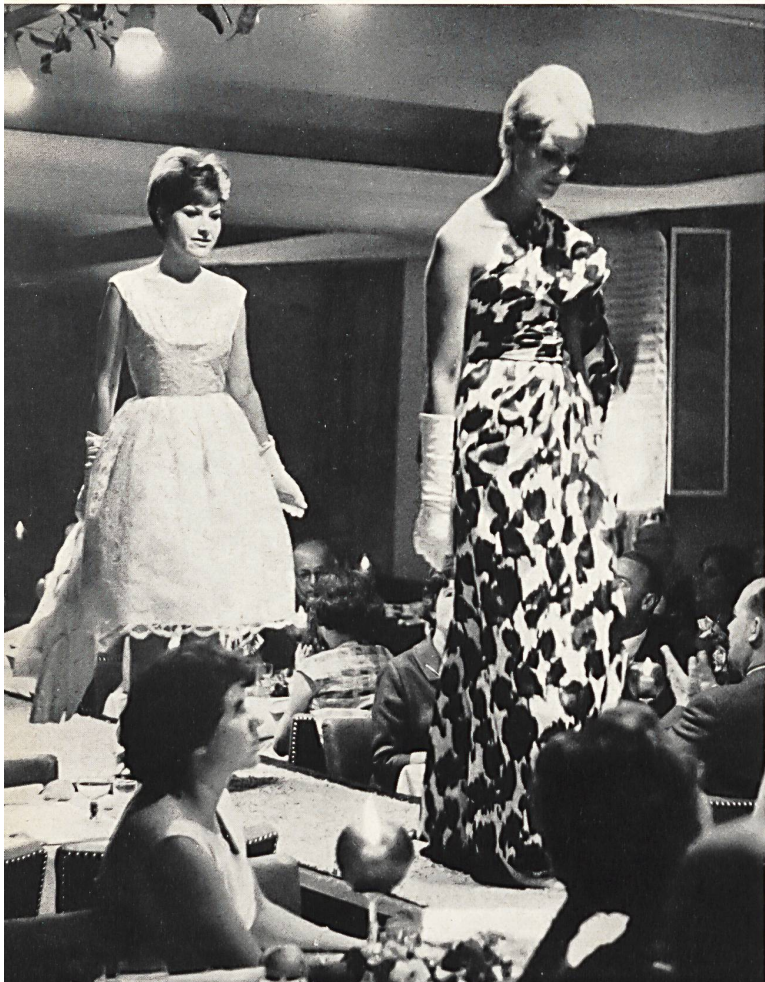
Egyptian Cotton

Cotton, which has been cultivated in the Nile delta for many thousands of years, is Egypt's main export item.

In 1960, Switzerland imported 21,467,664 Swiss francs' worth (\$ US. 4.98 million) of raw Egyptian cotton out of a total value of S.Fr. 144.8 million (\$ US. 33.7 million) for imports of this raw material. The raw cotton that Switzerland buys from Egypt is the high quality long staple cotton so highly appreciated by the St. Gall fine cotton fabrics and embroidery industries. In order to draw attention to this fact and to make Egypt in its capacity as a supplier of raw cotton better known to the Swiss general public, the Publicity Centre of the Swiss Cotton and Embroidery Industry in St. Gall, in compliance with a request of Mr. H. A. Hassan, Commercial Attaché of the U.A.R. for the cotton trade, organised a special publicity week on behalf of Egyptian cotton. This event was held from June 26th to July 1st in the Oscar Weber department stores in Zurich. In addition to the shop-windows, all of which laid the emphasis on Egyptian cotton in their displays, the interior decoration of the shop featured the

same theme, especially in the drapery department where photographs were displayed showing the growing, harvesting and preparation of the raw cotton. The attention of visitors was also drawn to Swiss articles made of Egyptian cotton.
